


Liberty

The Eliminate Project

In 2010, Kiwanis teamed up with UNICEF to wipe maternal and neonatal tetanus off the face of the Earth. Neonatal tetanus kills one baby every eleven minutes and is often contracted during unclean birthing practices, not uncommon in developing countries. Once contracted, the infant may suffer convulsions and be very sensitive to light and touch, making the tender moment of a mother holding her child painful instead of magical as it should be. The vaccine to save a mother and her future children from this terrible disease only costs \$1.80. With the initiative slated to end this year, we encourage Circle K to continue their fundraising efforts toward this wonderful cause. Circle K has already raised over \$305,000! Let's keep it going! Circle K International's goal per member per year is set at only \$7.40, less than 2 Frappucinos.

This year's **District Service Project** (DSP) is Serve Today, Cure Tomorrow with the goal that our members focus on cancer fundraising, community service, and support. All of our lives have been touched in one way or another by the tragedy of cancer, but when we work together and fight back, we can get closer to finding a cure! Many clubs are already doing great service projects and fundraisers related to cancer, so now we want hear about your awesome projects so that we can highlight your club in The Krier and on the website! Also, make sure your club logs your DSP related projects correctly on the Secretary Monthly Report Form, and if you have questions about that, please reach out to the fabulous District Secretary Melissa Campbell. If your club needs some ideas of where to start below are some examples:



VOLUNTEER: Call around to your local healthcare facilities such as Hospitals, Veteran Hospitals, and Cancer Care Centers to see if your club can volunteer there or host an event at the hospital for the patients. Your club members can hang out at the local Cancer Care Center while patients receive their treatments, which will be beneficial to both the patients and members.

DONATE: There are some great local organizations that collect items to donate o cancer patients and their families. Caitlin Smiles, similarly, focuses on helping children stuck in the hospital with long term illnesses, and it is based out of central Pennsylvania! Caitlin Smile's has craft bags, happy cards, and many other small activities that your club can put together during a meeting.

FUNDRAISING: Most clubs are already involved with great fundraising projects, but in case you aren't, here are some examples: Relay for Life, Alex's Lemonade Stand, and Penn State's THON. Even though most Relay for Life walks are in the Spring/Summer, your club can host an event anytime of the year and donate the funds to the American Cancer Society.

If your club does a super cool project benefiting our District Service Project, please share it with a member of the District Board so that we can share it with other clubs in the District. 

Project Highlight: Drexel University

Drexel University and their Kiwanis Club helped the Mantua community by partnering with Rebuilding Together Philadelphia on April 18, 2015.



Rebuilding Together Philadelphia (RTP) is an organization that brings volunteers and their communities together to improve the homes and lives of local, low-income homeowners. Since the homeowners do not make enough of an income to maintain their house, RTP provides the volunteers and tools to help the homeowners make exterior and interior renovations and clean up the house and the landscape surrounding the house. Drexel University Circle K (DUCK) worked with RTP and the homeowners to do simple repairs and renovations to the homes in Mantua on April 18th. We had 17 DUCK members go as well as two University City Kiwanians. RTP was an eight-hour event and all of our members had a blast together and met some of the homeowners that they were helping in the community.
