I pledge to uphold the Objects of Circle K International, to foster compassion and goodwill toward others through service and leadership, to develop my abilities and the abilities of all people, and to dedicate myself to the realization of humanity's potential.

Circle K Information

OBJECTS

- To emphasize the advantages of the democratic way of life;
- To provide the opportunity for leadership training in service;
- To serve on the campus and in the community;
- To cooperate with the administrative officers of the educational institutions of which the clubs are a part;
- To encourage participation in group activities;
- To promote good fellowship and high scholarship;
- To develop aggressive citizenship and the spirit of service for improvement of all human relationships;
- To afford useful training in the social graces and personality development
- To encourage and promote the following ideals:
 - To give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life;
 - To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships;
 - To promote the adoption and the application of high social, business and professional standards;
 - To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive, and serviceable citizenship;
 - To provide through Circle K clubs a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build better communities; and
 - To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism, which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism and goodwill.

Code of Conduct

By attending the District Convention, attendees agree to abide by the Code of Conduct. Attendees also understand that appropriate action will be taken for any infractions, including dismissal from the convention at his or her expense. The following Code of Conduct will be in effect during the convention.

a. No drugs of any nature, with the exception of prescribed medication, will be permitted in the possession of anyone in attendance.

b. The Circle K International Sponsored Conventions and Events Alcohol Policy, prohibiting the possession, sale, and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages during any event or situation sponsored or promoted by Circle K, will be enforced at all times during the event.

c. Sexual harassment is defined as behavior marked by aggressive or harassing remarks, unwanted physical contact or sexual advances, requests for sexual favors or other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature which is unsolicited and offensive to the individual or otherwise creates an intimidating, hostile or offensive environment. Circle K International will not tolerate sexual harassment.

d. There is no curfew hour; however, in consideration of others, Circle K members must be in rooms, with closed doors, by 1:30 AM and gatherings must be contained within the room. Loud noises and disruptive behavior will not be tolerated

e. No materials will be allowed to be posted on any walls, windows, or doors in the facility unless permission has been granted by the Pennsylvania District Administrator. The participant will be responsible for restoring all surfaces to their original state should this occur.

f. Smoking is prohibited at all events and activities. Additionally, attendees must adhere to the smoking guidelines of the camp.

g. Care shall be taken not to deface or destroy any property. Any damages will be paid for by the individual responsible.

h. All Circle K members are expected to conduct themselves as responsible, professional men and women and are required to attend all sessions and activities.

Code of Conduct

i. Appropriate clothing must be worn at all times.

k. Infractions of the code of conduct will be reported to the Pennsylvania District Board or the Pennsylvania District Administrator. Appropriate action will be taken for any infraction, including the dismissal of any attendee from the event at the expense of the individual.

l. By attending the conference, attendees agree that the Pennsylvania Circle K board may photograph or record your likeness, image, name, voice, and/or words, and may publish, display, reproduce, copy, and distribute your likeness, image, name, voice, and/or words for promotional, educational, or membership activities in all forms of media now known or later developed, including but not limited to advertising, training, websites, presentations, and marketing materials.

m. The code of conduct is in effect from the moment an attendee arrives at the event until the moment he or she departs convention.

Alcohol Policy

The possession, sale, and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages during any event or situation sponsored or promoted by Circle K International will not be tolerated.

Any member of Circle K International is said to be in attendance at an event from the moment of arrival at the event site or at 12:00 AM on the scheduled starting date of said event, whichever is later. A member is said to be departed from the event upon final departure from the event site or at midnight on the scheduled ending date of said event, whichever comes first. In any instance where pre/post event accommodations are included in the schedule for the event, or where an additional activity is planned and/or sponsored by Circle K International, or a district or club of Circle K International (i.e., a planned meal or district tour), such activities are bound by this policy.

Guests, alumni, and Kiwanis-Family members in attendance are asked to be respectful of this policy in terms of their use of alcohol at Circle K International events.

Standing Rules for the House of Delegates

- The official language of this convention shall be English.
- No one shall be admitted to the House of Delegates other than certified delegates, the parliamentarian, the District Administrator, and candidates for district office.
- A designated area will be sectioned off for guests wishing to watch the proceedings. At no time may a guest be permitted to speak in regards to any point of business that comes before the House.
- Delegates and guests are asked to not leave the House of Delegates except when the Chair calls a break.
- No one will be admitted as a delegate without an official delegate sticker. Stickers will not be reissued.
- The House of Delegates shall not be closed.
- Under no circumstances will delegates be permitted to leave the session immediately prior to, or during, the execution of any written balloting.
- Any amendment shall be written in English, signed by the maker and seconder, and presented to the District Secretary before it is moved.
- The maker of a motion shall be entitled to speak first in support of the motion or may yield the floor.
- Debate shall alternate between those speaking for and those speaking against a motion.
- No delegate may speak more than five minutes at a time unless allowed to do so by a majority vote.
- No delegate may address the assembly a second time on the same question until all delegates who desire to speak on the topic have spoken.
- A delegate shall not speak for or against a motion and move to close debate on the same recognition.
- Debate on any proposed resolution or amendment to the District Bylaws, shall be limited to thirty minutes.

Standing Rules for the House of Delegates

- A motion to move the previous question will not be in order until fifteen minutes of debate has taken place or the microphone is clear.
- A candidate may be nominated by any delegate when the chair declares nominations for that office to be open. No delegate may nominate more than one candidate for a single office. A candidate nominated from the floor during the House of Delegates will be allowed to run for office. However, if elected, their candidacy is not valid until all proper certification and necessary forms have been completed.
- Candidates for governor shall be allowed three minutes each to address the House or may yield their time to questions.
- All other district officer candidates shall be allowed two minutes to address the House or may yield their time to questions.
- The Laws, Regulations, and Resolutions Committee shall report to the delegates all resolutions referred to it. The resolutions committee may offer its recommendation on any resolution it reports.
- These rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the House of Delegates. Once adopted, these rules may be suspended or changed by a majority vote of those delegates.
- Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be the parliamentary authority for all matters of procedure not specifically covered by the Constitution and Bylaws of Circle K International, Bylaws of the Pennsylvania District of Circle K International, Pennsylvania District Policy Code, and these standing rules.
- Minutes of the meeting of the House of Delegates will be reviewed and approved by the Pennsylvania Circle K District Board at their next board meet

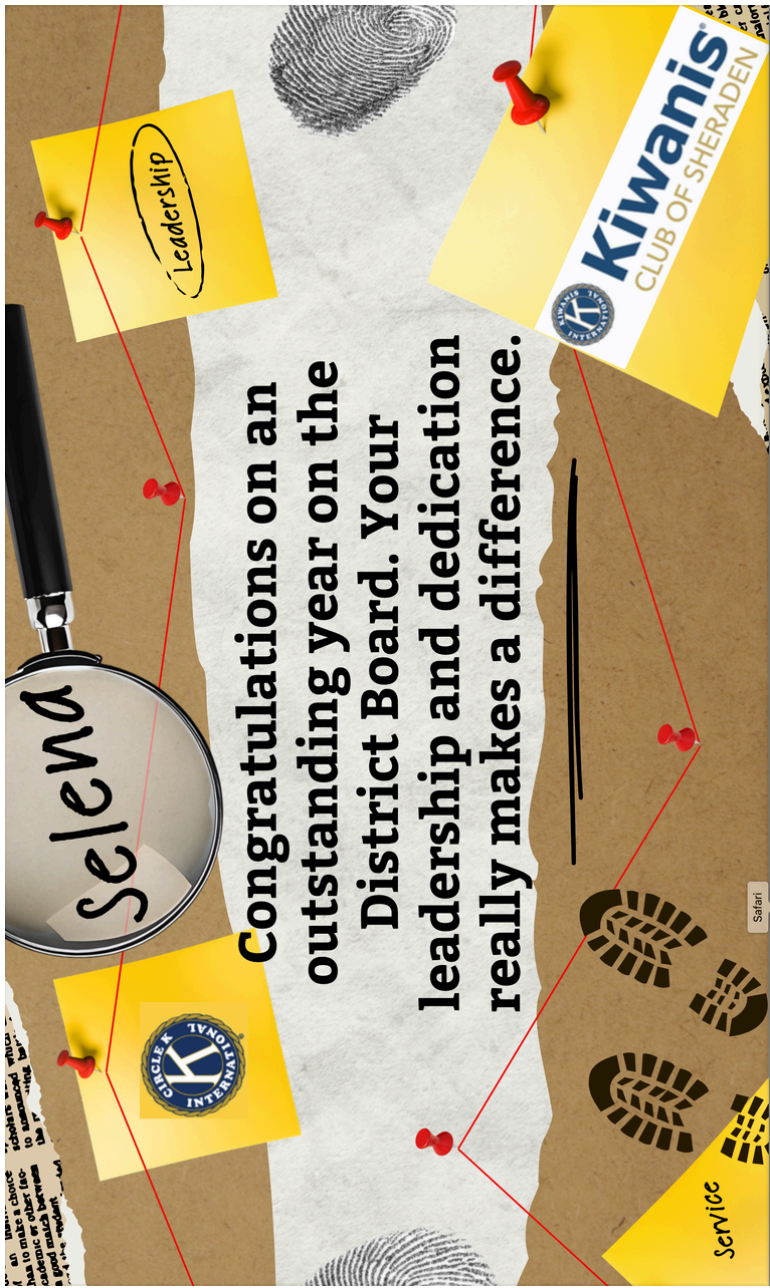
