Then we went into workshops where members participated in some 70s related activities. Family Feud and Being an Informed Delegate was popular. # NEW YEAR, NEW STRUCTURE

During the House of Delegates at District Convention, the House voted on restructuring how the District operates. The following amendments were approved:

- Merging the positions of District Secretary and District Treasurer together to create the District Secretary-Treasurer position
- Eliminating Lieutenant Governors from the District Board
- Allowing club presidents to become voting members of the District Board.

What does this mean? It means that during our board meetings, presidents will have the opportunity to voice their opinions and vote on official district business. All club officers are invited to attend the board meetings, but presidents must be present in order to vote on policy.

If anyone is interested in being the Executive Board, please reach out to me and we can talk through responsibilities, time commitments, and other things related to the positions.
